- 5) Overall Development:-The child not only gains knowledge but also develops qualities like patience, problem-solving, cooperation, and positivity.

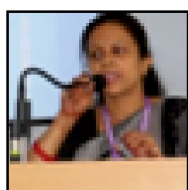
Effects of “Teaching Parents”
